Martin Haywood has completed a 4,000 mile bike ride to raise money for the NOTDEC children's centre in Uganda. After ten weeks pedalling, his is the sweet smile of success!

For the last 25 miles, he was joined by 15 cycling buddies and led the peloton home to energetic acclaim from a crowd of family, friends and supporters.

A Weight off His Mind?



Over the 10 weeks and 4,000 miles Martin lost 24 pounds – meaning he's leaner and fitter than he's been for years!

But WHY? At 50, why put yourself through all this?

In May 1998, Martin was diagnosed with testicular cancer. Reaching 50 was a huge milestone, one he wanted to thank God for, one he wanted to mark by making a real difference: by putting something back. The needs of children in Uganda, and of NOTDEC looking after them, spoke to him.

Getting into Hot Water





Until very recently, all NOTDEC's washing was done in cold water. It took forever: and the children's clothes still didn't look clean. Now, thanks to Martin's fundraising, some solar powered water-heating has already been installed (left) so housemothers have warm water in the laundry (right). With plans for hot water showers too, Martin's on-going fundraising is sure to be warmly welcomed!

An Open Goal

It was the words of a NOTDEC child that first touched Martin's heart.



It's true. NOTDEC's new site includes a huge football pitch with goal-posts and occasionally white lines too. But, unlike our kids here in the UK, NOTDEC children have no football kit.

In tropical Uganda, they play in their everyday clothes – which get very sweaty and dirty.

Martin is negotiating to get them some proper football kit.
